History

- Mdewakanton
 - "Those who were born of the waters"
- Descendants of the Mdewakanton Band of Eastern Dakota
- Involved in the Great Sioux Uprising
- Some of the Mdewakanton came back to Minnesota after the hanging and exiling to Nebraska
- ▶ 1899 the reservation was established by act of Congress in 1889

Population & Land

- ▶ 800 people
 - Not all of them live on the reservation
 - Due to limited land
- 1800 acres of trust land
- 426 acres of taxable fee land
- 249 acres of fee land
- 1290 acres of land were given to replace damage done by flooding



The Buffalo Project

- March 1992 the community accepted a male bison bull
 - From the Lakota Nation of South Dakota
- 1993 additional bison cows were purchased
- 40 bison in 2005
- Buffalo project supports:
 - Culture
 - Spirituality
 - Provides nutritional meat
- The goal is to keep growing the herd to provide



Treasure Island

- Employs 1500 people
 - ▶ 486 tribal members
- Generates \$13 million in annual state and federal taxes
- Spends \$50 million annually with Minnesota businesses
- 200 new business have been created to support the casino



Nuclear power

- Power plant was put on the reservation
- One of the rods malfunctioned
- The plant was taken down
- A nuclear storage locker was put up by their daycare
- The tribe was not happy about it and has been trying to get rid of nuclear waste

Government

- Separate from both state and federal government
- Governed by the Constitution and By-Laws of the community
- 5 member Tribal Council
 - ► Elected every 2 years
- Court consists of
 - Chief judge
 - Appellate court
 - Clerk of court
 - Guardian ad litem
 - Probation officer
