AABB – lines 1 & 2 rhyme
and lines 3 & 4 rhyme

ABAB – lines 1 & 3 rhyme
and lines 2 & 4 rhyme

ABBA – lines 1 & 4 rhyme
and lines 2 & 3 rhyme

ABCB – lines 2 & 4 rhyme
and lines 1 & 3 do not
rhyme

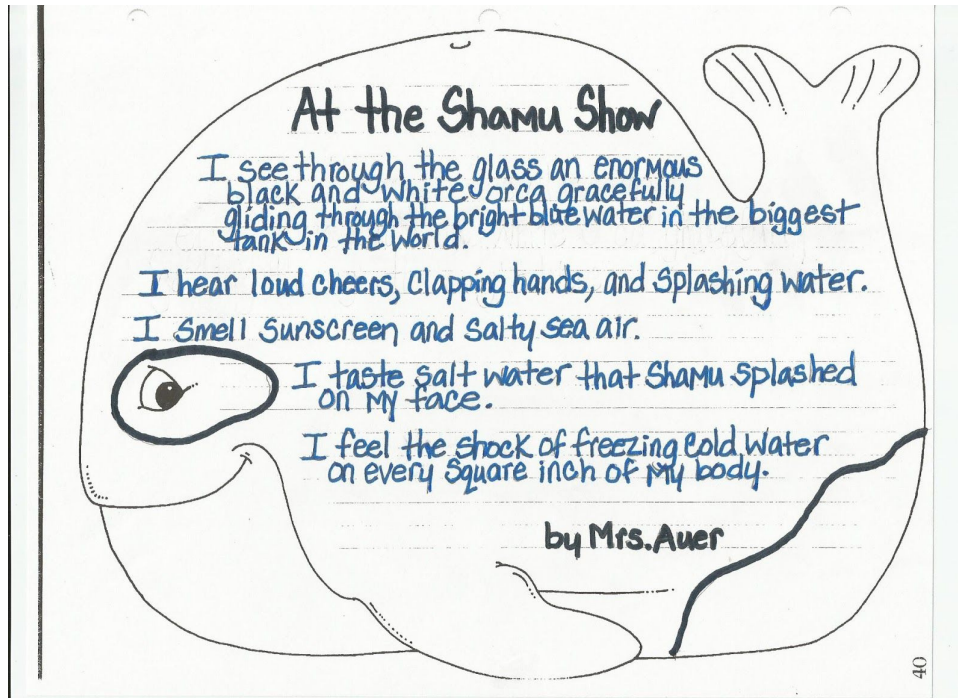

Diamante Pattern

- Line 1 – Your topic (noun)
- Line 2 – Two adjectives about
- Line 3 – Three “ing” words about
- Line 4 – Four nouns or short phrase linking topic (or topics)
- Line 5 – Three “ing” words about
- Line 6 – Two adjectives about
- Line 7 – Your ending topic (noun)

Winter
Frosty, Bright
Skiing, Snow Ball Fighting, Sledding
Icicles, Snowflakes, Vacation, Family
Swimming, Sun Tanning, Sweltering
Hot, Sunny

Diamante Poem all about

A large diamond shape (rhombus) is centered on the page. Inside the diamond, there are 11 horizontal lines of varying lengths, arranged in a diamond pattern. The lines are: 1. A single line near the top vertex. 2. Two lines below it, one on the left and one on the right. 3. Three lines below that, one on the left, one in the center, and one on the right. 4. Four lines below that, one on the left, one in the center-left, one in the center-right, and one on the right. 5. A single line near the bottom vertex.
